WHAT A CROC!


Kakadu National Park is saying "g'day" to three new croc-viewing platforms at the world-famous Cahills Crossing. The new site provides visitors with a safe space to see some of the Northern Territory's saltwater crocs in the wild and, for tourists looking to chomp down on some excitement, the site also has a picnic area linked by a rainforest walk. The best months to watch this world-class crocodile spectacular are August to November at the end of the dry season.
