

Little Venice

Where the most western part of the town meets the sea is the area known as "Little Venice". Here the buildings have been constructed right on the sea's edge with their balconies overhanging the water. During the 16th and 17th century pirating was common and it is believed this area was used for the necessary quick loading and unloading of goods.

Mykonos Windmills

A quintessential feature of Mykonos' landscape and a symbol of a rich virile past, the windmills are conspicuous by their snow-white color, spherical shape with the customary pointed roof made of the finest variety of wood.

Beaches

Mykonos beaches are renowned for their white golden sand and crystal clear waters. Many beaches have tourist facilities with beach bars, restaurants and water sports centers, although untouched natural beaches can also be found just a stone's throw away from Karma Pelikanos. Paradise Beach and Super Paradise Beach are two of the best beaches in the whole of Greece.

Day trip to Island of Delos

The island of Delos is just off the coast of Mykonos, near the centre of the Cyclades archipelago, and is one of the most important mythological, historical, and archaeological sites in Greece. The excavations in the island are among the most extensive in the Mediterranean; ongoing work takes place under the direction of the French School at Athens. The small, rocky, dry island of Delos was supposedly the birthplace of Apollo, and is thought to be in the middle of all the other Cycladic islands.

Mykonos Catamaran Sailing

If you want to discover the coastal idylls of Mykonos without the crowds, this catamaran cruise is the answer. With the help of your knowledgeable crew, you'll find secluded coves, unspoiled beaches, and archaeological sites around Mykonos. Mykonos lies between Tinos, Syros, Paros and Naxos. The island spans an area of 85.5 square kilometres and rises to an elevation of 341 metres at its highest point. There are 10,134 inhabitants, most of whom live in the largest town, Mykonos, which lies on the west coast. The town is also known as Chora. The island is characterized by its picturesque town, its idyllic quarters and beautiful coves. Apart from its natural beauties, Mykonos is mostly known for its exciting nightlife in the capital and the surrounding endless beaches where parties last for days. The atmosphere of Mykonos is unique for all crowds, ages and tastes. The world-famous facilities of Mykonos coexist with the traditional and serene neighbourhoods and provide the fans of the island with a rich diversity of scenery and daily images. The island offers countless small bars and nightclubs in the capital but the most romantic spot you will find it in the famous quarter Little Venice. The cosmopolitan island is also known for its large gay community and the famous parades that take place in Mykonos every year.

Paradise Beach

It's not called "paradise" for nothing: a beautiful sandy beach with warm, clear waters. Hippies introduced nude bathing to Mykonos during the 1960s at this particular beach. Founded by Freddys Daktylidis, this was the beginning of a culture, a movement that would introduce Paradise Beach to the world. Access was quite difficult and only word of mouth could spread this passion for music, sun and love. Every summer the number of Paradise-goers kept rising. Freddy's son and Paradise Beach owner Markos Daktylidis took his father's legacy to new heights. The resort now features multiple restaurants, bars and facilities with thousands of people from across the globe coming every year. World-class DJs play to a massive crowd inside Paradise Beach Club, currently ranked as #17 best club in the world.







Super Paradise Beach

Throughout the years, Super Paradise has made its name a synonym to Party in Mykonos. Packed with clubbers, jet-setters, models and VIPs, do not get surprised if you spot a celebrity among the crowd or dancing next to you. Super Paradise calls for fun in the sun amidst an eclectic crowd. Meet a great mix of personalities and bodies enjoying the vibes of the Beach Club. Unwind in a relaxed atmosphere early in the day and get yourselves ready to party as time passes by. The music gets louder and the Beach Club becomes quite "the scene". Whether dancing on the platforms or enjoying a cocktail, find yourselves in the hottest Beach Club in Mykonos.

Outdoor Cinema

Situated in the greenest neighborhood of Chora, an outdoor cinema is tucked away among oleander, olive, cypress, palm, pomegranate and pine trees, from where the local cicadas perform their usual summer-long concerts. According to the British Independent newspaper, it ranks among the most beautiful open-air cinemas in the world. Although it's named after Manto Mavrogenous, a heroine of the 1821 Greek Revolution, for locals the cinema's location will always be known as the Garden of Meletopoulos. Privately held until the middle of the last century, it was donated to the municipality of Mykonos in 1957 by the lawyer, benefactor and founder of the town's public library loannis Meletopoulos. The cinema doesn't restrict itself simply to showing films. It also hosts exhibitions, book presentations, children's theater and art workshops. It has become a popular haunt for artists, a recreational area as well as a cultural focal point for locals and tourists. Finally, don't be surprised if you happen to catch a glimpse of the local pelican pushing his way through without a ticket to nab a goldfish from the cistern. He has a little house of his own in the garden.



Mykonos Shopping

Mykonos is a shopaholic's wonderland, with trendy stores and boutiques galore and a mind-boggling variety of merchandise. But how can someone find their way to the right places, in a town purposefully built to confuse and disorient all strangers? The answer is simple: Get lost! The cobblestone paved streets of Mykonos Town are truly labyrinthine. very Chora, as the locals call the main towns on all the islands of the Aegean, was built on purpose in a completely chaotic way, a defense against the bloodthirsty pirates of the post-Byzantine era: pillagers would storm the town, invading from the port, only to find themselves lost, confused and ultimately cornered in one of the countless dead-end pathways. Chora is a consumer's wonderland, where cute boutiques offer their sophisticated treasures right next to tourist shops filled to the brim with "made in (insert name of any Far East country)" souvenirs. On the other side of the souvenir shop, you're likely to find a store representing a super-exclusive international brand, or a bakery, or an art gallery, or maybe a ridiculously expensive (even for high-end travelers) jewelry shop, or an entrance to an outlet that sells faucets and doorknobs. What's even better is that you can simply pretend that you're not shopping at all, you're just on a sightseeing stroll on a truly unique, traditional Greek island.

Alley Cafe Cocktail Bar

Alley Bar is located in the heart of the island, in Chora Mykonos, just meters away from Poseidon Hotel. This amazing cafe and cocktail bar is open all day long, offering relaxation and entertainment under the sounds of lounge music. Enjoy a coffee or fresh juice and watch the world go by or perhaps a refreshing cocktail is more your scene. The Mykonian Secret comes highly recommended!







Sunset Yoga

Based on the hatha yoga (vinyasa breathing) system of Ashtanga, Sunset Vinyasa will be taught at a beginning level, but modifications to intensify the asanas will be given. Simply jump into your yoga garb and head up to Castle Panigirakis, a listed, post-industrial monument overlooking Chora, at around 19:00. Up there, overlooking the town an instructor holds the most enjoyable yoga sessions that are timed to get the most out of the sunset view, with support from Delos in the distance, emanating its magical energy. If you prefer to salute the sun on the beach our Estate Manager can happily arrange, with plenty more programmes available such as aerial yoga (which involves being suspended in hammocks), wake-up yoga and various kinds of fitness activities, such as cross-training and TRX, as well as the use of power bags, agility ladders, kettlebells, medicine balls and more.

Rarity Gallery


Rarity Gallery was established in the heart of Mykonos in 1994. The two curators Vassilis Matsaidonis and Christos Nikolaou have dedicated their artistic mission to sharing ground-breaking contemporary artists with the public. Spearheaded by their own personal knowledge and passion for art, their goal is to offer an original and carefully curated aesthetic experience aimed at strengthening the public's appreciation for contemporary art, whilst honouring the artists, their exposure and their reputation.

Set within the impressive backdrop of an early 20th century Mykonian manor house, the gallery is divided into five rooms each one following a distinct thematic narrative, whilst altogether remaining in constant visual communication.



Mykonos Cooking Class

Discover the secrets of Mykonos' cuisine on this enjoyable 6-hour cooking class.
